ONE HALL HEALTH COMMITTEE PRIORITIES AT-A-GLANCE

Areas of focus were identified as **Access, Collaboration, and Education**. For each priority a workplan is underway to improve measurable outcomes for mental and behavioral health in our community through One Hall.



ACCESS

- Increase access to resources through Unite Us, a social care network that allows for electronic referrals and communication between non-profits and service organizations to connect local individuals
- Ensure that resources produced are available to special populations and in different languages.



COLLABORATION

Strengthen the partnership structure that will support ongoing collaborative efforts



ACCESS

NGHS Emergency Department Peer Support Program



An example of a mental health initiative at NGHS is the Emergency Department Peer Support Program, which was established in 2017 with the support of the Georgia Council on Substance Abuse. This program offers overdose patients at NGMC's EDs in Gainesville, Braselton, and Winder the immediate support and companionship of a Certified Addiction Recovery Empowerment Specialist.

Since its inception, CARES have provided assistance to individuals through over **8,900 encounters**. This represents initial encounters as well as follow up encounters with those re-admitted to the emergency Department.



PURPOSE: Bring the transformative experience of reading to the community to navigate difficult topics, explore new perspectives, and strengthen bonds between neighbors



WHAT IS MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID?

Mental Health First Aid is a course that teaches you to identify, understand and respond to the signs of a mental health or substance abuse problem. The training gives people the skills they need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone experiencing a mental health crisis.

WHO IS THIS TRAINING FOR?

Mental Health First Aiders are people who want to make their community healthier, happier and safer for all.

WHEN IS THE TRAINING OFFERED?

There will be **two virtual MHFA trainings** per month from **9am-3:30pm**. Please note that there is up to 2 hours of online pre work needed prior to virtual trainings. This allows virtual trainings to be 6 hours instead of the required 8 hours needed for in person trainings.

WHO LEADS THE TRAINING?

Trainings will be led by instructors certified by Mental Health First Aid USA, who teach from a national curriculum, tailor discussions to their participants and compile a list of local resources for help.



CUMULATIVE REPORT


The cumulative report created in early 2024 provided a higher level glimpse at the work done on the Reach Out campaign in 2023. This report was:

Hall Goes Green

In collaboration with NAMI Hall, the Ryan Joiner Foundation, and UWHC, **nearly 40 businesses or organizations** displayed signs and banners and lit their offices in green during May for Mental Health Awareness Month to show support for mental health action.

The One Hall Mental & Behavioral Health Committee coordinated a mental health walk down Green Street for Mental Health Action Day. More than 75 people participated by wearing green and walking down Green Street to help raise awareness of the importance of mental health.




