Affiliated Psychological and Medical Consultant works with children and adolescents (starting at age 5 and up) to adults in individual psychotherapy, couples therapy, family and group counseling, as well as EEG/Neurofeedback training. Many different insurance plans are accepted. However, not all doctors accept all insurances.

No sliding scale or reduced fee services. Self-referrals are welcome.

Office Hours: Administrative office hours are 9-5 Monday-Friday. Each psychologist has varied appointment schedules.

Perpetrators of domestic violence often hurt family pets to control and intimidate their victims. Ahimsa House, Inc. - a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose name means "nonviolence" - is dedicated to helping the human and animal victims of domestic violence across Georgia reach safety together.

Our Direct Services Program

- **A 24-hour statewide crisis line** Emergency shelter for animals of any kind while their owners reach safety from domestic violence.
- **Veterinary care for pets with injuries and other health conditions due to the abuse**, as well as preventive veterinary care and spay/neuter Forensic veterinary examinations to document abuse and assist in prosecuting abusers.
- **Assistance in transporting pets** to accompany their owners to safety (both within GA and across the country)
- **Pet food, pet supplies, payment of pet deposits** in transitional housing, and other assistance victims may need Crates and other pet supplies for domestic violence shelters, including shelters that have their own on-site housing for pets.
- **Assistance in including pets in safety planning.**
- **Legal advocacy to assist victims** in listing their pets on temporary protective orders.

Outreach Services Program

- Training and cross-training for a wide range of human services and animal protection agencies
- Direct outreach to the public to raise awareness about this issue, including speaking at meetings of civic organizations, setting up information booths at community festivals and workplace health fairs, and placing information brochures and posters in veterinary clinics and other strategic locations across the state.
- Consultation to prosecutors on cases involving co-occurring animal cruelty and domestic violence, including expert witness services.
- A directory of programs of this type elsewhere
- Participating in interdisciplinary conferences and meetings, such as Domestic Violence Task Forces, to keep the issue of animal abuse in domestic violence "at the table".

Al-Anon is a mutual support program for people who are living with - or have lived with - someone whose drinking created problems for themselves or others. Al-Anon recognizes that alcoholism is a family disease. The disease affects all those who have a relationship with a problem drinker. Alcoholism may emotionally, spiritually, and often physically affect loved ones in addition to the drinker. Al-Anon and Alateen's primary purpose is to help friends and families of alcoholics. However, many of our members first came because a friend or relative had a drug problem. Most eventually came to realize that someone else's drinking had also negatively affected their lives.

Alateen meetings are for young people, usually teenagers, whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking. While Alateen members run their own meetings, adult Group Sponsors are there for safety and to provide guidance. To ensure the safety of Alateen meeting, Group Sponsors must be in compliance with Alateen Safety and Behavioral Requirements. Alateen helps young people understand how alcoholism affects the lives of all who are associated with a problem drinker and helps them find effective ways to deal with their personal problems. The nearest Alateen meeting is currently located in Cumming. Al-Anon meetings welcome and encourage teens to participate in their meetings. Where there are no Alateen groups, teens are encouraged to participate in Al-Anon meetings. Teens between the ages of 13-18 are also welcome to participate in Alateen Chat Meetings and can register at <https://al-anon.org/newcomers/teen-corner-alateen/try-an-alateen-chatmeeting/>

Additional Information -

- There are no dues or fees. Members make voluntary contributions because each group is self-supporting.
- No appointments are necessary. Anyone concerned about someone else's drinking is welcome to walk in and attend.
- Anonymity is protected. The identity of all Al-Anon and Alateen members, as well as members of Alcoholics Anonymous, is protected.
- Al-Anon is a separate fellowship from Alcoholics Anonymous.

Child and Adolescent Services:

- **Mental Health Services** Avita offers a variety of outpatient treatment services for youth and their families. Licensed staff members work with children and adolescents to enhance their mental, emotional, and social functioning by giving them the tools they need to succeed.
- **Substance Abuse Services** It is vital to reach youth who are facing addictive diseases early. Our adolescent substance abuse treatment program provides assessment and treatment for addiction at community facilities that are close to home.
- **Crisis Prevention And Intervention** services are available to prevent crisis through rapid response to critical situations. Our trained staff provides supportive counseling, consultation, and identification of resources and referrals.

Children with Special Needs is a program for children from birth to age 21 with either developmental delays, chronic illnesses, or at high risk to develop medical or developmental disabilities. There are four programs underneath Children with Special Needs. Each program targets a specific age group and has services coordinated for this population.

Programs:

Babies Can't Wait

Babies Can't Wait provides Early Intervention (EI) for families of infants and toddlers with developmental delays and disabilities age birth to 36 months. The eligibility evaluation process is provided at no cost to the family. Early intervention services are provided in natural environments settings that are natural or typical for a same-aged child without a developmental delay and may include the home or community setting. The Babies Can't Wait program will coach parents on how to support their child's development and participation in typical daily routines and activities; provides information to families about topics of interest; links parents to support groups and informational resources; and provides services including occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech language therapy. BCW takes a team and family-based approach to services due to the central concept that supporting a child's family lends itself to supporting the child. This team creates an Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) that is a written treatment plan that maps out the EI services a child and family will receive, as well as how and when these services will be administered. It details the child's current levels of functioning, specific needs and goals for treatment (referred to as outcomes). The program bills insurance for services and family cost is based on income and determined at eligibility.

Children 1st

Children 1st serves as an assessment and referring agency for identifying newborns who have or are at risk for poor health and development. Children ages 0-21 that have established medical conditions or biological/ environmental risk factors are eligible for enrollment. An in-home assessment is completed by staff to identify any needs that the family may have. Children 1st links families with healthcare providers in the area, as well as offers referrals to other resources. This is a free program for all who choose to participate. There are no financial eligibility requirements.

Early Hearing Detection and Intervention

Newborn hearing screening is screening for hearing loss. All babies should be screened for hearing loss before 1 month of age. The screening is typically done before the baby leaves the birthing facility. EHDI includes screening for hearing loss in the birthing hospital; referral of those who do not pass the hospital screening for rescreening; for newborns who do not pass the rescreening referral for diagnostic audiological evaluation; and, linkage to appropriate intervention for those babies diagnosed with hearing loss. Technical assistance and training about implementing and maintaining a quality newborn hearing screening program is provided to hospitals, primary care physicians, audiologists, early interventionists, and public health staff.

Children's Medical Services (CMS)

CMS is a statewide program that supports children, youth and young adults (birth – 21) with special health care needs and their families. Children's Medical Services provides assistance to eligible families and young adults with accessing timely and affordable health care services as well as needed resources within their communities.

Children's Medical Services works with the child and young adult's primary and specialty medical specialists to provide or coordinate for:

- Inpatient/Outpatient Hospitalization
- Durable Medical Equipment
- Medications and Supplies
- Diagnostic Testing

THE MEDICAL ELIGIBILITY INCLUDES BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS

Asthma, cystic fibrosis, and other lung disorders, some hearing disorders, neurological and neurosurgery disorders including seizures, benign tumors, hydrocephalus, and others, orthopedic and/or neuromuscular disorders including cerebral palsy, spina bifida, scoliosis, clubfeet, congenital or traumatic amputations of limbs, and others, visual disorders including cataracts, glaucoma, strabismus, and others, diabetes and other endocrine and genetic disorders, craniofacial anomalies (including cleft lip/palate), congenital cardiac conditions.

- **Senior Life Center-** The Senior Life Center is open Monday through Friday to persons 50 years of age or older who reside in Hall County. As an Active Adult and Nutrition site, the Senior Life Center features a cardio fitness room, game room, pool table, ping pong, hair salon, library, weekly exercise classes, blood pressure screenings, monthly educational classes and nutritious hot lunches.

Crisis Hotline – We are available to answer your questions and provide assistance at any time. Our crisis hotline is answered 24/7, 365 days a year. The number is 770-536-5860. All calls are handled confidentially.

Shelter – Gateway offers short-term housing for victims of domestic violence and their children.. Parents and dependent children (boys and girls) up to age 18 may be admitted. The shelter is in a confidential location. Gateway can help find solutions for housing pets. Some longer-term transitional housing is available to families exiting the emergency shelter, but the inventory is limited.

Nonresidential services – Clients living in the community who have experienced domestic violence may come to Gateway for individual support, support groups and assistance accessing community resources. Some limited counseling appointments may be available.

Classes and Support Groups for Survivors – Support groups are available to those who live in the community or to those who live in one of Gateway’s housing programs. Groups are free and are offered in English and Spanish. Meals and childcare are provided, and some transportation assistance may be available. 

General Types of Cases Handled:

- Advance Directives and wills for persons at least 60 years old or persons in hospice care

- Terminating or changing guardianships for elderly or disabled
- Nursing home discharges or denials
- School disciplinary issues

Eligibility Guidelines:

- Clients must be below 125% of the poverty guidelines set by the federal government (some deductions can be made, all perspective clients should check with Georgia Legal Services Program to determine eligibility).
- Clients must not have assets over set asset limit (all perspective clients should check with Georgia Legal Services Program to determine eligibility).
- Clients who live in the counties covered by the Elderly Legal Assistance Program who are at least 60 years old have no income limits or asset limits.
- Clients must be citizens of the United States or be documented in some way or be battered spouses/children or victims of trafficking. There are different types of immigration documents that will satisfy this requirement, check with Georgia Legal Services Program to see if a person or family qualifies. In addition, children who are U.S. citizens can sometimes be represented even if their parents are not.

Intake Procedures:

- Perspective clients can call every weekday between 9 and 5:00 pm and speak with an intake worker. The intake worker will determine case and financial eligibility. If criteria is met, the client is given an appointment with an attorney or paralegal. This appointment can be in the Gainesville office, a satellite office or by phone. Clients may be asked to fax documents prior to the appointment with an attorney or paralegal.

Good News Clinic provides non-emergency primary care including dental and medical care to Hall County residents ages 18-65 without private insurance, Medicaid or PeachCare. Individuals with Medicare or other insurance and without dental insurance can qualify for services at the dental clinic if income and residency requirements are met. Referrals are made for those who need specialized care. In addition, there are requirements that individuals and families must meet in order to receive care. Patients are seen by appointment only.

Requirements:

- ❖ Applicant must be a Hall County resident.
- ❖ Household income must be at or below 150% of the federal poverty level.
- ❖ Cannot have insurance or be eligible for Medicare, Medicaid or PeachCare.
- ❖ Individuals with Medicare or other insurance and without dental insurance can qualify for services at the dental clinic if income and residency requirements are met.

Application Process:

Application interviews are Monday-Thursday mornings at 8:20am-8:45 am. Individuals must come in person to apply and provide the following necessary documents. Application packet is online:

- ❖ Proof of Hall County residency (a bill showing name and address, etc.)
- ❖ Proof of household income (paycheck stub for last four pay periods, unemployment income letter, DFCS letter or certified letter from person providing assistance with living expenses)
- ❖ A picture ID

Services:

- ❖ **Sam Poole Medical Clinic-** provides primary healthcare services to people with multiple and complex medical problems that would otherwise, and repeatedly, end up in the emergency room. It is the principle focus of Good News Clinics to provide this large and still growing patient base with the continuity of care that is necessary to keep them out of the hospital. New patients receive medical and laboratory screenings to identify any areas of concern. The information is then carefully reviewed by the medical staff to determine patient needs and choose appropriate physician volunteer for follow-up appointments.

- ❖ **Health Access-** Health Access provides specialty care referrals, diagnostic tests and treatment for uninsured patients referred by primary care providers (self-referrals are not accepted), including the Northeast Georgia Physicians Group practice at the Hall County Health Department and Good News Clinics.

- ❖ **Green Warren Dental Clinic-** The Green Warren Dental Clinic provides acute dental care for adults including extractions and fillings. A prevention program is conducted for all new patients explaining proper brushing and flossing techniques, and nutrition for oral health. Following the class, each patient receives a dental exam including x-rays and an appointment with a dentist. Children are scheduled for sealant and fluoride treatments.

- ❖ **Good News Clinics Dispensary-** All patients who qualify are signed up for PAP (Patient Assistance Programs) assistance during their first appointment. Pharmaceutical samples are the source of many medications dispensed by the GNC dispensary.

Cancer Screenings provide physical exam including breast exam and mammogram referrals to women on a sliding scale fee based on their income. Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention Program provides breast and cervical cancer screening to low-income women with no insurance.
- **Immunizations-** for all ages, hearing, vision and dental certificates and Immunization certificates for school and daycare are offered. Walk in clinic.
- **Communicable Diseases -** Treatment of a variety of infectious diseases such as tuberculosis, sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), and HIV/AIDS. Call to make an appointment.
- **International Travel Clinic –** The Hall County International Travel clinic provides pre-travel consultation with the purpose to prepare international travelers for healthy travel experiences. The clinic provides recommended and/or required immunizations and is a designated Yellow Fever Vaccination Center. Medications may also be recommended and prescribed for prevention of malaria, altitude illness, and treatment of traveler's diarrhea.

The Kinship Navigator Program serves as a one-stop shop for information and referral services to grandparents, relatives and other caregivers who are currently raising a child. The Kinship Navigator Program started more than 10 years ago as a state and county initiative to provide information, referral and follow-up to grandparents and other relatives raising children to link them to the benefits and services that they or the children need. The Georgia Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS) has launched this program in direct response to the increasing number of grandparents and other caregivers who have assumed responsibility for raising another relatives' child(ren). As of 2013, 16 percent of all children in another's care are placed with kin. The Kinship Navigator Program is designed to support and assist relative caregivers, understanding the importance of keeping children within their family unit, when their biological parent cannot adequately provide for them.

Who does the Kinship Navigator Program serve?

A kinship caregiver serves as a short or long-term caregiver for relative child(ren). A kinship caregiver can be a grandparent, aunt, uncle, sibling or anyone who has established a 'kin-like' bond with the child(ren). The majority of kinship care arrangements are informal, private arrangements between parents and relative caregivers, while other situations arise as a result of involvement with the child welfare system. Kinship caregivers may also apply for child support services at no cost at their local Division of Child Support Services (DCSS) office or by completing an application for services on-line.

Kinship Navigator Program Scope :

The Kinship Navigator Program is located statewide. The kinship navigators assist kinship families in identifying and locating resources within their local community. The program's overarching goal is to close the gaps and/or delays with service delivery to kinship caregivers. DHS focuses on providing a responsive strength-based supportive role to our kinship families.

Kinship Navigator Program Goals :

- Help caregivers understand and access programs and services available to them.
- Develop proactive ways to address caregiver needs and develop an informal and formal support system.
- Create a safe and supportive home environment for children outside of foster care, including assisting with family planning, early identification of needs for additional services such as therapy, counseling, educational and/or mental health services.

Planning for Healthy Babies provides no cost family planning services to eligible women in Georgia. Eligible women can apply online or applications can be picked up at the local health department or DFCS office.

- Inter-pregnancy Care (IPC) - family planning and additional services for women who have delivered a very low birth weight (VLBW) baby. This is a baby weighing less than 3 pounds 5 ounces. You can receive services for 24 months.
- Resource Mother Outreach – A specially trained case manager will help women, already receiving Medicaid, who have delivered a VLBW baby. You can receive services for 24 months.

What's covered?

- Annual physical exams including pap smears;
- Birth control and multivitamins with folic acid;

- IPC services including primary care and dental services, substance abuse treatment services, a Resource Mother and more.
- If you had a very low birthweight baby, you can also receive primary care and dental services, substance abuse treatment services, a Resource Mother, etc.

- If you receive Medicaid and delivered a baby weighing less than 3 lbs. 5 oz. you are eligible for only Resource Mother services.
- If you do not receive Medicaid. you are eligible for family planning services.
- If you do not receive Medicaid or are losing coverage, and delivered a baby weighing less than 3 lbs. 5 oz. you are eligible for IPC services .

SOURCE blends primary medical care with preventive and supportive services for older and disabled Medicaid recipients, through a service known as “Enhanced Case Management.”

Key characteristics of **SOURCE** are:

- Financial and programmatic integration of primary medical care with case management of home and community-based services.
SOURCE members are served by a panel of participating physicians.
- Expanded case management to ensure active advocacy for members in all components of healthcare.
- Provider performance standards exceeding basic licensing requirements; **SOURCE** providers are accountable in areas that include reliability of service, competency and compatibility of staffing, responsiveness to member preferences or concerns and coordination with case managers.
- Three levels of care – based upon functional needs of members.

All **SOURCE** members must:

- Have Medicaid and Supplemental Security Income; and
- Be 65 or older, with a chronic medical condition OR under 65 and disabled.
- In addition you must meet intermediate Nursing Home level of care criteria.

Targeted Conditions Include:

- Diabetes
- High Blood Pressure
- Asthma or other pulmonary problems
- Arthritis (rheumatoid and osteo-)
- Stroke
- Amputations

PRIMARY MEDICAL CARE

- **Care Path Implementation** – A dynamic, interactive process whereby the case manager supports goals of the **SOURCE** member and caregivers, promoting optimal health and independence.

Overall health and social circumstances, severity of impairment and informal support determine the level of case management contact required for each person. **SOURCE** case managers maintain at least monthly contact with each member; routine home visits are scheduled at 90-day intervals.

Overview

Service Options Using Resources in a Community Environment (SOURCE) links primary medical care and case management with approved long-term health services in a person's home or community. All SOURCE clients must be eligible for full Medicaid and meet nursing home level of care.

SOURCE operates under authority of the Georgia Elderly and Disabled 1915c Medicaid Waiver and provides Home- and Community-Based Services to frail elderly and physically disabled people who meet the Intermediate Nursing Home Level of Care.



At the end of 2018, more than 16,000 people were enrolled in the SOURCE program. A comprehensive assessment determines eligibility and how much care a participant needs. An individual care path is designed based on the need for medical monitoring and assistance with functional tasks. Family members and other informal caregivers as well as staff from support agencies participate in care paths. In addition to core services, SOURCE offers personal support services, assisted living services, extended home health, home delivered meals, adult day health care, emergency response services and 24-hour medical access to a case manager and primary care physician.

Whispering Angels Youth Ranch is a faith-based non-profit that is dedicated to providing hope, healing, love, and acceptance to young minds through the spirit and love of a horse, in a nurturing farm environment. The ranch facilitates healing to children that are facing challenging circumstances in their lives. Referrals can be made online.

Requirements for Participation:

- Open to all children ages 8-18 who have experienced trauma or tragedy such as abuse, neglect, loss of a loved one, or abandonment
- Willingness to participate
- Parents must remain at the facility for the duration of the session
- Cost is free to all participants
- New Orientation visit is required before sessions can begin

Ministries Offered:

***Chore time:** Every child and leader pair will complete a small chore during session time. Chores at the Ranch are meant to teach the importance of serving others by giving through the work of your own hands and to also teach responsibility. Often this opportunity empowers children in knowing that their efforts can make a difference to those around them.

***Horse Time:** The majority of children who come to WAYR are drawn to the ranch because of the horses. During sessions children will first learn how to groom and care for their horse. After they have successfully learned how to care for their horse they will get the opportunity to learn to lead their horse and eventually will learn how to ride. All riding is done with an adult leading the horse. We do not offer horseback riding lessons.

***Devotion Time:** Children who attend the Ranch will likely be involved in group devotional time. During group devotion children and mentors may read the Bible together, read a book together, share about their day, share their struggles and pray together. Community is an important part of a person's walk with God as it opens up our hearts to God and others.

***Art, Woodshop or Garden Time:** Whispering Angels has two fully stocked buildings specifically for arts and crafts; the art room and the woodshop. We also have a full summer and fall garden. Arts, crafts and time in the garden provide serenity in similar ways as the horses do. In our art room, child and mentor pairs can watercolor paint, acrylic paint, oil paint, throw pottery, make clay models and more. Child and mentor pairs can also spend time in our woodshop. Past woodshop projects have included making birdhouses, swords, chairs, cars and more.

***One-on-One Time:** Child and mentor pairs may also choose to spend some of their time on the swings, benches or in the grass chatting about life. Although our mentor volunteers are not certified counselors, they are prepared to talk about anything that the child would like to open up about. One-on-one time can be an important part of the child's time at the Ranch because many of the children we serve come from backgrounds of broken hearts and broken trust.

Sessions can include one or many of the above components, or even sometimes something entirely unique.

WorkSource partners with area universities, colleges, and private training providers to provide assistance with the cost of occupational skills training. The participant receives training in an in-demand field and local business is able to find the talent they need. This program is funded by the WorkSource Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) under the leadership of WorkSource Georgia Mountains (WSGM). *Participants are not obligated to repay any funds received.* WIOA funding works alongside other federal and state financial aid such as HOPE and Pell.

Training Assistance:

WIOA can assist with costs related to training expenses (books, tuition, tools, uniforms and shoes, certification, licensing, testing fees, etc.). It may also be able to help with transportation and childcare fees. Training can take place at colleges and universities, technical colleges, private education centers, and continuing education programs.

Work Training Program:

WorkSource Georgia Mountains has grant money to pay for short-term training for high-demand jobs. Eligibility requirements apply.

GED:

WIOA assists students attending GED programs. All GED services are free but individuals must meet eligibility requirements.

College/Technical College Assistance:

Eligible applicants pursuing college or technical college may receive assistance with the cost of books, tuition, and supplies needed to complete their educational programs. Approved programs should be completed within two (2) years or six (6) semesters. Assistance with transportation and childcare may also be provided.
